#### LMC Christmas Appeal 2024

Our Christmas Appeal is working with Christian Aid's Appeal to support refugees fleeing from the civil war in Sudan. This is a forgotten war, but one every bit as brutal as those in our news daily. Christian Aid shares the story of Shede, a mother and grandmother from Darfur, Sudan who worked in a restaurant and tended her organic farm, which sustained her family. In April 2023 her life changed in an instant when conflict erupted across Sudan. Shede's brothers were killed and she had to flee with her daughters and granddaughters to Wedweil Refugee Settlement in neighbouring South Sudan. Shede is unable to contact her husband who is still in Sudan. Food and rations are scarce in the refugee settlement and there is no employment. Shede's elder daughters had to leave the settlement to find work, leaving Shede to care for her grandchildren. Christian Aid is working alongside its partner, Smile Again Africa Development Organisation (SAADO), to provide vital financial help to families like Shede's. To date, they have supported 4,550 people there with small cash grants to allow families to buy essential items such as food, medicine, blankets, and clothing.

Rather than using bank transfer, you can donate easily using the <u>LMC Digital Envelope</u> and invite family/friends to do so.

Alternatively there will be **Christian Aid envelopes available at Scotforth Road and Cornerstone** from the beginning of December so you can give by cash or cheque at any point in the month. As usual, we also assign the loose collections on the three Christmas Services to the Appeal. (Full details of donating at the end)
